Summary

IF... 1) You are "in the game" on any given LCOM Thursday – whether it is an ABCD General Mtg Day game, a Thursday Play Day game (either 9 or 18 holes), or an LCOM tournament/event that does NOT include guests

AND... 2) On any hole of play during the game/event, you get a birdie or a chip-in (where your ball lands in/rolls into the cup from your location off the green), you are welcome - during or after the event - to go to the LCOM bulletin board area in the Ladies' Locker Room, open the top right hand drawer, pull out a pencil and the respective small card, fill out the card with the details, have one of your fellow players for that day sign the same small card, and drop the card in either the "birdie" box or the "chip-in" box in the drawer.

On a quarterly basis, the Birdies & Chip-Ins Coordinator will ensure all names in the boxes will be entered into a raffle for a prize at the General Meeting – one quarterly prize for birdies and one quarterly prize for chip-ins. You do not need to be present at the General Meeting to win a prize. Winners get a \$25 credit posted to your credit book account.

Birdies and chip-ins qualify, even if you do not finish the game for the day. If you complete the round with an attested scorecard and have holed out on every hole, you can qualify for low gross and low net for the month. No "X" may be on your scorecard to qualify for Low Gross & Low Net.

We realize the hardest part of this is to remember to turn them in at the end of the round. It helps to circle the hole on your scorecard that you qualified for the birdie or chip in, so you will not forget to fill out your small card.
